Donor Profile An Interview with Drew McCandless, Senior Vice President, Sherwin-Williams

For Drew McCandless, philanthropy is personal. He, his wife Shelley, and his family care about people who need food and shelter, military families and veterans. They are careful to involve their daughters — Katey, Hayley and Sam (Samantha), empowering them to decide some of their annual donations. By involving their children, they hope to pass on their love of philanthropy for generations to come.

Drew, Senior Vice President for Excellence Initiatives at Sherwin-Williams, also gives back in his professional life. He serves as a board member for Make-A-Wish Foundation of Northeast Ohio and is a Trustee for Marymount Hospital.

It is through that prism of philanthropy that Drew sees the value in Hudson Community Foundation's Donor Advised Fund (DAF) program to provide "creative ways to accomplish your philanthropic desires."



Drew's financial advisor, Craig Pickering, of The Pickering Group at UBS Financial Services presented DAFs as a natural solution for Drew's goal to donate highly appreciated assets. "It's a financial mechanism with tax benefits and opportunities," he observes.

While any DAF could offer the tax advantages, Drew says HCF's local connection was key to his family's decision to work with HCF. "This organization meets our goal of being part of the community," he says. Their family fund has already made grants to local charitable organizations.

Community Impact

Imagine a never-ending source of funds that can be used to improve Hudson's future. When you do, you've imagined the basic premise behind an endowment—a fund that has enough money in it to give back to the community yearly, in perpetuity. That's the goal of the Hudson Community Foundation. Since our founding in 2000, we have provided start-up funds, ongoing support and financial guidance to many of Hudson's most endeared events, programs and causes. From supporting the incredible in-school programs developed by Hudson Community First, to seeding and supporting Taste of Hudson, the Farmer's Market and the annual Fireworks.

We all recognize that Hudson is special. What we may not realize is that this is not accidental. It takes the work, vision, and the generosity of many dedicated individuals, to honor and nurture what those before us have created. HCF touches many organizations and individuals within our great community. Look for us. You'll see us in our schools, our gardens, our buildings and our lives.







Make an Enduring Mark

The power of an endowment

When we think of those farsighted civic leaders in Hudson's past whose efforts have made a difference in our community for generations, the names of Ellsworth, Morgan, Murdough, and Malson come to mind. Thanks to the endowment strategy that Hudson Community Foundation now offers, families, organizations and corporations can join those ranks, by creating a charitable endowment.

The concept of endowment is simple: Distribute over the long-term what you reasonably expect to earn from the endowment. For example, a typical endowment strategy is: Expect to earn five percent and spend five percent. Superior investment performance, inflation, and new contributions are invested back in the fund. In this way, the endowment can be expected to grow and go on in the name of the donor virtually forever.

Individuals, families, charities and corporations can apply this strategy to many types of HCF's funds, including donor advised funds, field of interest funds, designated funds, scholarship funds and legacy funds. Below are examples of endowments at work in the community.

Here are some examples:

- The Hudson students attending college thanks to scholarship grants from the fund of a donor who died five years ago.
- The private school's music department relying on annual support from a deceased donor's fund at HCF virtually forever.
- The former resident who intends to create an endowment for the benefit of the school's tennis program on her death.
- The anonymous resident who intends to add to the Enrich Hudson Forever Fund at HCF when he and his wife are gone "to support imaginative and creative thinking as Hudson charities address their challenges ahead."

Seton Tuition Assistance Endoument Fund

Many residents of Hudson are familiar with Seton Catholic School through its reputation and presence in the community; or from seeing the students in their uniforms throughout town; or just by passing the school as they drive along Stow Road. What many do not know is the story of its growth, how this U.S. Department of Education Blue Ribbon School of Excellence is drawing families from throughout the region, or how its operation is sustained.

From an opening day with only 83 students in 1997, Seton Catholic has grown to serve 435 students (kindergarten through grade eight), representing 280 families from five counties, 22 communities, and 27 congregations. As an independent school within the Diocese of Cleveland, Seton Catholic receives no operational support from the Diocese, any parish or religious order. The ability to operate the school is possible based on two primary sources of funding—tuition charged and fundraising.

These factors led to the vision and wisdom of an anonymous donor to set in place a permanent endowment fund to benefit the school with a focus on tuition assistance and financial aid. By working with Hudson Community Foundation, the Seton Catholic School Tuition Assistance Endowment Fund benefits current and future students. As the fund grows, more and more assistance can flow to families in need while alleviating some of that burden from the school's finances.

"We strive to make the Seton experience available, accessible, and affordable to all families seeking an excellent faith-based school. Thanks to this donor and HCF, we have a fund that will benefit generations to come," says Bill Cushwa, Seton parent and development director. "This fund is a living instrument of ongoing support for the school. Now that it has been established, we will look to others to help nurture it, add to it, and grow it," Cushwa added. "The legacy of this gift will be the hundreds helped for future generations."









Legacy Society

Make a difference in the lives that follow

Can you remember the first names of your grandparents? Your great grandparents? It would be difficult for most; the shelf life of remembrance is short.

That's where understanding of legacy comes in. Although the dictionary describes legacy as something that is received from ancestors, the focus of a charitable legacy is something that is given. Legacy giving is a way of saying to those who follow, "I was here and my life mattered."

Maya Angelou who once said: "You shouldn't go through life with a catcher's mitt on both hands; you need to throw something back."

Creating a family charitable legacy can be as simple as adding a few words to your will or other estate plan document. It can take the form of naming your fund at HCF as beneficiary of a bequest, a charitable trust, a retirement plan, a 401(k), an IRA, or a life insurance policy.

Legacy giving is for caring individuals who want to be recognized for their generosity while living but fund it at the time of their death. It is for people who want to pass on family values to their children, who want the flexibility to support multiple charities with a single testamentary gift, and for those who want assurance that their charitable intent will be continued in their name (or with anonymity) for many years to come.

We are pleased to announce the founding and opening of the

David Hudson Legacy Society,

named after our founding father. The purpose of the Society is to recognize and thank those in our community who want to establish their legacy fund now but prefer to fund it later (at the time of their death). The Society is for those whose passion for making a difference is the essence of "what makes Hudson, Hudson." With just a few words added to your will or estate plan documents, you can make a difference in the lives that follow.

Good Advice From a Successful Advisor

Karen Hoy has an interesting perspective on Donor Advised Funds. Actually, multiple perspectives. As a financial advisor for Merrill Lynch Wealth Management in Hudson, Karen Hoy sees the value to her clients, and therefore her business. As a long-time Hudson resident, she sees the value to the community foundation and therefore philanthropic causes in the community. As a former board member for Hudson Community Foundation (HCF), Karen understands the mutual value that comes from working relationships between HCF and financial advisors. The passion comes through in Karen's voice, "I love Hudson Community Foundation and its Donor Advised Fund (DAF) program."

"I'm local. I love Hudson. The majority of my clients are here. Once they put their charitable assets with HCF, I can continue to stay involved as an advisor. My clients like that." She explains that her clients also like the fact that a Donor Advised Fund at HCF allows Successor Advisors, where most other Community Foundations terminate family involvement at the time of the donor's death. Successor Advisors are often the children of the donor and can make recommendations regarding the family's charitable giving after the parents are gone. "It sets a lasting example to future generations and leaves a family legacy."

Another advantage, she points out, is that an HCF DAF "allows the client to make a large gift [to their fund at HCF] often at taxtime, and then HCF issues the checks to the multiple charities they wish to support. This is done in the name of the fund...often named as a family foundation. My clients love how easy HCF and their staff make the process. And at HCF you are talking to real people—members of the community who specialize in this type of work...not an 800 number. And because of that personal involvement, HCF is actually more able and willing to take on complicated gifts."



She mentions one client who felt strongly about philanthropy, but he had no family to continue his giving beyond his life. He was considering lump-sum gifts to multiple organizations at the time of his death. Karen was able to show him how setting up a DAF would be a simple way to do his charitable giving during his lifetime, but could also carry out his wishes after his death. He could make lifetime contributions and receive an immediate tax deduction, and use the same tool to be the recipient of his estate. He was pleased to know his named DAF will give annual gifts to his chosen philanthropic causes, even after his death, carrying his name forward. He was also comforted to know that the fund will grow tax-free under Karen's management.

The recipient charities win too. They have the advantage of being able to count on his annual gift as a predictable stream of support. And the Hudson Community Foundation benefits from the customary administrative fees generated to provide this service. Karen points out, "Why not have those fees help your local community, especially since they come out of the already donated funds?"

Karen says she sees the need to educate advisors about the advantages of DAFs... and the program at HCF in particular. "Many Financial Advisors in Hudson love this community and would like to give back to it as a thank you for the career and lifestyle they enjoy. They can do that by guiding their clients to a DAF at HCF," Hoy encourages. Although she has many other wealth management and estate planning tools at her disposal, she says the DAF is "a wise strategy for my clients to have available."

Hoy also stresses the important role of the advisor in offering Donor Advised Funds. "For the most part, my clients don't know [about DAFs] unless I tell them." Because of the benefits for both donors and advisors, "it's a home run—when it's offered," she emphasizes.

The local connection of HCF is also important to Karen. Her family came to Hudson when she was one year old. She grew up here and says, "I'm a fan of the Fireworks, Taste of Hudson and the Farmer's Market." She says it's important to her to support the efforts of HCF and the work they do in the community. "As a professional wealth manager I have the opportunity to offer my clients a tool that serves their needs while at the same time helps support our local community foundation. The client I just told you about wasn't even a resident of Hudson, but the HCF DAF offers unique characteristics that made it the perfect tool for him."

She wants people to understand that the client directs the fund. "Gifts can go anywhere in the United States," she explains, "they don't have to stay in Hudson. What sets apart the HCF Donor Advised Fund program is three things; the ability for the donor and family to continue working with the financial professional of their choice, the ability for the fund to carry on for multiple generations, and the fees benefit where we live and raise our families." When compared with other DAFs, Karen says "HCF always wins, hands down, because of these unique features."

The Advisor's View

An Interview with Keith Smith, CFP,® Financial Advisor

Many people may know Keith Smith as the newest member of Hudson City Council. Others may know him from service on the Hudson Economic Growth Board, the Hudson Golf Advisory Board and the Leadership Hudson steering committee, class of 2011.

Keith's day job gives him visibility in the community as well; he has been a financial advisor since 2005, and for the last three years he has helped clients as a CERTIFIED FINANCIAL PLANNER™ and Financial Advisor for the Western Reserve Group at Morgan Stanley Wealth Management. It comes as no surprise, then, that Keith chooses to work with Hudson Community Foundation (HCF) to accomplish the philanthropic wishes of his clients.

"The Donor Advised Fund (DAF) program has been a huge deal for my clients," Keith says. One of his clients set up a DAF that will serve as a family foundation for multiple generations simultaneously. The DAF structure enables the family not only to determine the charitable organizations to receive gifts, but also continue to be involved in how the assets are invested and grown. "When a family donates, it's a personal thing," Keith explains, "they like to stay involved."

Keith's staff loves the DAF program at HCF, as well, because it saves significant time for them. The family is often donating highly appreciated stock, which used to be time-consuming when giving to multiple charities. By using a DAF, Keith now simply transfers the stock to his client's HCF account. HCF handles making the grants to the donor's recommended charities. "My staff used to have to do all of that," Smith says.

The family's company is able to make gifts to the DAF, as well. Keith noted the company has more than 200 employees and is involved in various local sponsorships. Many of the grants go to local organizations. "It feels good to be involved in this way—with my clients, with Hudson and with philanthropy," he said.



Donating highly appreciated stock can be complicated when multiple recipients are involved. However, a DAF at HCF simply transfers the stock from the client's account to one in the name of the donor at HCF. Personal financial advisors still manage both accounts, but HCF handles the otherwise complicated process of making grants to the selected charitable organizations.

When the tax code changes, a DAF provides a good solution because it enables the donor to make charitable decisions later. The DAF tool separates the tax-strategy decision from the grant-making decision, yet still gives you the maximum tax benefit.

Light up the Sky Every July

Hudson Community Foundation continues its leadership role in bringing the Independence Day Fireworks to the Hudson community. For the past six years HCF has led the fundraising initiative, with residents, businesses, and local Foundations generously donating. The first fundraising goal is to cover the approximately \$30,000 per year in expenses to organize and deliver the fireworks, with excellent support from the Hudson Police, EMS, Fire, Parks and Service departments.

However, the overarching goal is to build the Hudson Fireworks Endowment Fund to a point that it will provide the source of future funding without the need for annual fundraising efforts. Once annual expenses are covered, any remaining monies raised are placed in the Fireworks Endowment Fund. Through the generous giving by hundreds of residents, businesses and Foundations, the Fireworks Endowment Fund balance stands at \$258,000, despite several years of difficult economic conditions. This balance leaves the fund over one third of the way to its overall goal. The HCF Board continues to seek all options to complete the fund as rapidly as possible.

A New Way to Get Started - \$2,500 Initial Investment

If the \$10,000 starting point for a Donor Advised Fund prevented you from experiencing the most popular form of charitable giving in the United States, you'll be interested in the new Horizon Donor Advised Fund. The Horizon DAF at Hudson Community Foundation allows you to take advantage of all the benefits of a Donor Advised Fund with a starting point of only \$2,500.

Add As You Can

You can add to your DAF as often as you like, and its assets grow tax-free. With the Horizon DAF you can make one annual grant of \$250 —and you advise HCF as to which tax-exempt pubic charity you would like to support, anywhere in the country. Once your fund reaches \$10,000 you may make as many grant recommendations as you would like.

Established in Your Name

The fund is established in the name you choose, such as The Smith Charitable Fund or the Smith Family Foundation. And even though HCF takes care of verifying the charity and administering the grant, the grant is made in the name of your fund.

HCF Chairman Don Tharp explains: "HCF's mission is to empower simple, smart and meaningful philanthropy. It is our hope that our new Horizon DAF will give all Hudson families a simple tool to optimize their charitable giving through this popular, tax-wise strategy."
